ITEM SUMMARY

Staff was asked to coordinate a presentation on vehicular neighborhood access. To provide Council a complete picture of how neighborhoods are designed, the presentation will include members of staff from Community Development, Fire, Public Works, and a local engineer to describe the private side of the design work.

BACKGROUND

Staff was approached by council to provide background to inform council on the regulatory considerations involved in development of neighborhoods related to emergency ingress and egress. Of particular importance, was to understand how these regulations provide for egress in large-scale emergencies. Staff will explain the intent of the various regulations that influence these issues and how various departments and the development community work together to ensure that projects are built in accordance to standard.

Staff will provide a conceptual journey of a development project from the beginning through completion with a focus on ingress and egress. Particular focus will be on the scope of the various codes and what those standards are intended to achieve. Because none of these regulations can effectively impact a positive on their own, how each component works together will be illustrated. Finally, the presentation will focus on a shift in the City of Prescott towards participation in Fire Adapted Communities (FAC) approaches. In June, council will be provided an in-depth work session on FAC that will highlight the particulars of that approach and how it can help improve the community's ability to live in a fire adapted environment to increase public safety, natural resource conservation, and economic vitality.
